

mote our Safety Initiatives. As you may know, the entrance doors to HCC are identified with numbers to assist members of the Congregation and other groups that utilize the facility, as well as First Responders, to enter HCC through the designated and most appropriate door(s).

Safety Team would like to remind everyone that, in order to minimize confusion and promote safety, it is important that the numbers on the doors remain clear and visible. We are working to replace the existing numbers with numbers that will be easier to read from a distance.

Our second reminder is to please be sure not to leave any outside doors propped open for any reason - not even a few inches, or for a few minutes. It's easy to forget or think, "we're going to pop right back in, so we're just propping it open for a few minutes", but we are really fighting to keep destructive pests out of the building, especially now that weather is nicer! We appreciate your help.

# Coffee With Jesus





#### Mythology & Beliefs: Joseph Campbell study




